Hi all,
As you are aware, the wood sign at 100 Ave and 148 St will be removed and stored until such time as we (as a group) determine the best approach to restore/replace the sign.
There are 2 other signs around the perimeter of Green Timbers Urban Forest that are in need of similar treatment. They are located at 96 Ave (west of 148 St on the north side) and on 100 Ave at the parking lot entrance.
Similar to the 110 Ave and 148 St sign, the Parks Division is proposing to remove these signs in the near future and store them temporarily until such time as we (as a group) determine the best approach to restore/replace the signs.
Your comments on this proposal are welcome. We would like to move towards removing the signs fairly soon so please let me know if you have concerns on the matter prior to July 7th.

- Our Tree Care team has started watering the Gary Oak trees on a weekly basis
